Це вчить нас бути вдячними. Вдячність завжди має духовний вимір.



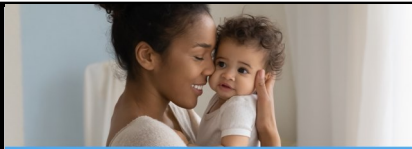

Holy Fathers of 7th Council

Sunday Tropar, tone 4: When the disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the glorious news of the resurrection* and cast off the ancestral condemnation,* they proudly told the apostles:* "Death has been plundered! Christ our God is risen* granting to the world great mercy."

Tropar of the Holy Fathers, Tone 8: O Christ our God, You are above all praise,* for You established our Fathers as beacons to all the earth.* You led us to the true faith through them.* O Most Bountiful Lord, glory be to You! Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Sunday Kondak, tone 4: My Saviour and Deliverer* from the grave as God has raised out of bondage the children of earth* and shattered the gates of Hades,* and as Master, He rose on the third day.

Prokimen, tone 4: How great are Your works, O Lord: You have made all things in wisdom.

Verse: Bless the Lord, O my soul; O Lord my God, You are exceedingly great.

Epistle: A reading from the Epistle to the Hebrews. (13: 7 – 16)

Brothers and Sisters! Remember your leaders who spoke the word of God to you; consider how their lives ended, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Do not be carried away by all kinds of strange teaching. It is good to have our hearts strengthened by the grace of God and not by foods which are useless to those who take them as a standard for living. We have an altar from which those who serve the tabernacle have no right to eat. The bodies of the animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sin offering are burned outside the camp. Therefore Jesus died outside the gate, to sanctify the people by his own blood. Let us go to him outside the camp, bearing the insult which he bore. For here we have no lasting city; we are seeking one which is to come. Through him let us continually offer God a sacrifice of praise, that is, the fruit of lips which acknowledge his name. Do not neglect good deeds and generosity, God is pleased by sacrifices of that kind.

Alleluia Verses: Poise yourself and advance in triumph and reign in the cause of truth, and meekness, and justice. You have loved justice and hated iniquity.

Gospel: John 17: 1 - 13

At that time Jesus looked up to heaven and said: "Father, the hour has come! Give glory to your Son that your Son may give glory to you, inasmuch as you have given him authority over all mankind, that he may bestow eternal life on those you gave him. Eternal life is this, to know you, the only true God, and him whom you have sent, Jesus Christ. I have given you glory on earth by finishing the work you gave me to do. Do you now, Father, give me glory at your side, a glory I had with you before the world began. I have made your name known to those you gave me out of the world. These men you gave me were yours; they have kept your word. Now they realize that all that you gave me comes from you. I entrusted to them the message you entrusted to me. They have known that in truth I came from you, they have believed it was you who sent me. For these I pray -- not for the world but for these you have given me, for they are really yours. Just as all that belongs to me is yours, so all that belongs to you is mine. It is in them that I have been glorified. I am in the world no more, but these are in the world as I come to you. O Father most holy, protect them with your name which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. As long as I was with them, I guarded them with your name which you gave me. I kept careful watch, and not one of them was lost, none but him who was destined to be lost -- in fulfillment of Scripture. Now, however, I come to you; I say all this while I am still in the world that they may share my joy completely."

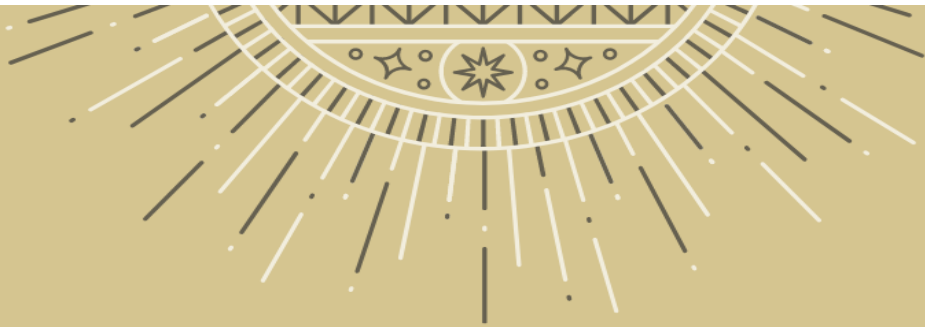

Commemoration of the Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council, Second Council of Nicaea (787 AD)

An **Icon** can be translated as an “image” or “resemblance” customarily used within religious and liturgical contexts. The term icon may be applied to mural paintings, mosaics, tapestries, or embroideries. Within our Ukrainian Catholic tradition, many icons we see depict images of Jesus Christ, the Blessed Virgin Mary, the saints and angels. It is common practice today for our liturgical services to contain the presence of holy icons (e.g. the *Iconostasis* of Christ and Mary separating the sanctuary/altar area of the Church from the nave and the narthex). Yet, this wasn’t always the case. The Catholic Church experienced a period of *iconoclasm* in 8th and 9th centuries AD.

Iconoclasm involves the belief in breaking/destroying holy icons and images. Many people (even today) believe that icons are forms of idolatry. As the Church was forming in the first millennium, it went through an era when the emperors legally banned icons from liturgical services (most notably Emperor Leo III), with idolatry being the main argument. Standing in opposition to iconoclasm and in defence of the veneration of holy icons and images was **St. John of Damascus** (around 675 – 749 AD). He fervently supported the belief that Christians do not worship images. Instead, they worshipped God through them (icons not idols but symbols). More importantly, St. John of Damascus argues that **since God took on an incarnate physical form (became fully human except for sin), Jesus Christ has given warrant to the Church’s depiction of Him in physical images.**

The *Seventh* (and last) of the Ecumenical Councils (787 AD) is also known as the *Second Council of Nicaea* (the *First Council of Nicaea* in 325 AD being the first of the First Seven Ecumenical Councils). After much debate between the *iconoclasts* (“icon-smashers”) and the *iconodules* (“venerators of icons”), two significant decisions came forth from the Council. First, the veneration of icons is what the Church teaches, and icons are “open books to remind us of God.” Secondly, icons protect the **entire doctrine of the Incarnation**. God in His divine form cannot be depicted, but He gave His only Son, Jesus Christ, to take on human flesh. Since Christ has a material, physical body, it is correct and appropriate to depict Him in holy icons and images to be revered.

Our *Catechism of the Ukrainian Catholic Church: Christ Our Pascha* highlights the importance of this Seventh Ecumenical Council as it was this Council that

“[...] condemned Iconoclasm and confirmed the veneration of icons of the Lord Jesus Christ, the most holy Mother of God, and the angels and saints. Along with this, the Council distinguished between adoration, which is due exclusively to God (in Greek, latreia), and veneration (in Greek, proskynesis), which we render unto icons, the Gospel Book, the cross, and the relics of the saints.” (§ 591)

When an icon is painted, it is painted ***in*** and ***for*** prayer. Icons reveal God’s truth through contemplation, concentration, meditation, and silence (active listening). They are holy images that teach and challenge those who venerate and gaze upon them. They are entrances into the presence of that which is sacred and divine (windows to heaven). Icons are **theology written in images and colour**. The Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council viewed icons precisely in this manner. May we remind ourselves today of the struggles and victories our Catholic faith has endured throughout the centuries.

Glory be to Jesus Christ! Glory be forever!

Pope Announces the Names of New Cardinals, Including Bishop Mykola Bychok

After the Angelus on Sunday, October 6, 2024, Pope Francis announced a consistory on December 8 to celebrate the installation of the new cardinals. The list also includes Bishop Mykola Bychok, Eparch of Melbourne of the UGCC (Australia).

“Let us pray for the new cardinals so that, affirming their devotion to Christ, the merciful and faithful High Priest, they may help me in my ministry as Bishop of Rome for the good of all God’s holy people,” the Holy Father asked.

A Cardinal from Ternopil. Bishop Mykola Bychok was born on February 13, 1980 in Ternopil.

In July 1997, he entered the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, undergoing monastic and theological formation in Ukraine and Poland, and received a license in pastoral theology.

After taking lifelong vows on August 17, 2003, he was ordained a priest on May 3, 2005. As a priest, he performed various pastoral ministries, was the abbot of the Redemptorist Fathers Monastery and a parish in Ivano-Frankivsk, and a provincial economist. Since 2015, he has served at the parish of St. John the Baptist in Newark, USA, of the Archeparchy of Philadelphia of the UGCC.

On January 15, 2020, the Vatican announced that Pope Francis had appointed him as the new Eparch of the Eparchy of Saints Peter and Paul in Melbourne of the UGCC in Australia. The episcopal ordination took place on June 7, 2020, at St. George’s Archdiocesan Cathedral in Lviv. His Beatitude Sviatoslav was the main consecrator, and the co-consecrators were Bishop Ihor Vozniak, Archbishop and Metropolitan of Lviv, and Bishop Petro Loza, Auxiliary Bishop of Sokal-Zhovkva.

It is noteworthy that Bishop Mykola Bychok, at 44 years of age, will become the youngest cardinal.

This is a significant event for the entire Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church and the Ukrainian people. In the history of the UGCC, there have been 5 bishops who were proclaimed cardinals: Metropolitan Mykhailo Levytskyi (1774–1858), Metropolitan Sylvester Sembratovych (1836–1898), Patriarch Josyf Slipyj (1892–1984), Patriarch Myroslav Ivan Lubachivskyi (1914–2000), and Patriarch Lubomyr Husar (1933–2017).

In the history of the Catholic Church in Australia, there have been 7 cardinals, the last of whom, Cardinal George Pell, passed away in January 2023. Thus, Bishop Mykola Bychok will become the sixth cardinal in the history of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church and the 8th cardinal in the history of the Catholic Church in Australia. *The UGCC Department for*



ANNUAL CLERGY RETREAT 2024

The annual clergy retreat, took place this year from September 30 to October 4. It was a much-anticipated event, marked by its location on the serene Hecla Island and led by the retreat master, Fr. John Sianchuk, CSsR. Over the course of four days, 21 archeparchial priests, including our Metropolitan Lawrence Huculak and Bishop Andriy Rabyi, three religious, and one seminarian gathered together in an atmosphere of deep reflection, prayer, and brotherhood.

Hecla Island, located in the heart of Lake Winnipeg, is known for its natural beauty and tranquility. The island's quiet charm and natural beauty greatly contributed to the spirit of the retreat.

This year retreat master Fr. John Sianchuk, member of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists Fathers), led this year's retreat with a profound sense of spirituality, wisdom, and pastoral sensitivity. His sessions were both contemplative and instructive, guiding the participants through a variety of spiritual reflections on the scriptures, and teaching of the Fathers of the Church.

Throughout the retreat, Fr. Sianchuk drew on the rich spiritual traditions of the Eastern Church, weaving together reflections on the Gospels with insights from Church Fathers, Saints, Mystics and personal experience. His teachings encouraged the clergy to consider their own spiritual wellbeing and relationship with God, reminding them that their ability to minister effectively depends on their own prayer life. He emphasized the importance of a deep connection with Christ in their vocation, urging them to find their strength and renewal in the sacraments.

The retreat schedule was carefully designed to create an environment of prayer and reflection, with a balance of communal worship and personal time for contemplation. The day began with First Hour, followed by breakfast and first sessions with the retreat master. The Divine Liturgy was celebrated daily, providing the clergy with the spiritual nourishment.

The Vespers and reflections closed each day, offering a time for the participants to reflect on the day's teachings and their own spiritual journey. Moleben to the Most Holy Mother of God and Moleben to the Blessed Nikita Budka were part of the evening prayers.

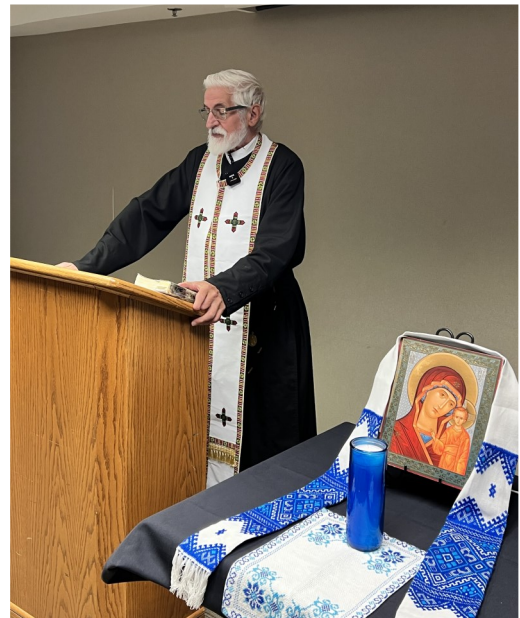
While the retreat was primarily a time for individual reflection, it was also a nice opportunity for the clergy to come together as a community. Meals were shared in a communal setting, providing a relaxed environment where the participants could share stories, experiences, and spiritual insights.

Many of the priests expressed how much they valued the sense of brotherhood that the retreat fostered. Everyone was able to discuss both the joys and the struggles of their ministry with fellow clergy members in a supportive setting.

As the retreat came to a close on October 4, the participants returned to their parishes renewed in spirit and faith. The time spent in prayer and meditation, the guidance of Fr. John Sianchuk, and the fellowship shared with one another equipped the clergy to return to their ministry with a renewed sense of purpose and energy.

This year's retreat was not only a time of spiritual nourishment but also a testament to the enduring bond of brotherhood among the clergy. As they left Hecla Island and returned to their various parishes, they carried with them the lessons, prayers, and support that will sustain them in their ministry ahead.

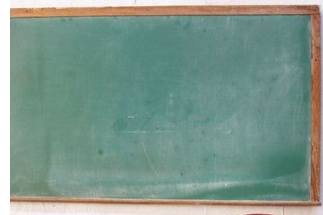

Basic Guidelines for Reception of Holy Communion

You are a member of the Catholic Church; You have participated in the Sacrament of Confession at least during the Easter or Christmas seasons this past year if not more frequently; You attend Divine Services regularly; Your lifestyle is consistent with the teaching of the Catholic Church; You have kept the Liturgical fast – no food at least one hour prior to the Divine Liturgy (water and medicine does not break the fast). You have been in church from the beginning of the service, or at least heard the Gospel. To the best of your ability, you are in the state of Grace. ***If for any of these or other reasons you cannot receive Holy Communion, you are welcome to come for a blessing. Please indicate to the priest that you would like to receive his blessing. For those who are divorced and living common-law the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist cannot be received. You are welcome to come for a blessing. (If you are divorced with a Church annulment, and remarried in the Church you are more than welcome to receive the Holy Sacraments.)***
